#### 3. Egeneevaluering/Self assessment

Due to its complex structure – spanning the department's three Master programmes in human geography, geographies of sustainable development, and physical geography – GEO 308 is a demanding course to administer and implement. Last year, several changes were made in response to the 2020 course evaluation (fewer joint lectures, more parallel lectures, additional student-led seminars), which resulted in a broadly positive response from the previous cohort of students. These changes were upheld in Autumn 2022.

In general, the course examination results were again broadly positive in 2022. Given the diversity of student enrollment in GEO 308 – and the correspondingly wide range of individual student backgrounds – many students experience the course as quite challenging. However, the 2022 cohort broadly performed quite well on the final home exam. Once again, the student-led seminars appear to have been particularly helpful in preparing students for the exam.



#### 5. Oppfølging/Follow up

As mentioned above, GEO 308 is an exceptionally challenging course to administer and implement. Given that GEO 308 spans the department's three Master programmes in Human Geography, the Geographies of Sustainable Development, and Physical Geography, the course must necessarily cover an uncommonly wide range of themes, concepts, academic traditions, and reading materials.

Particularly given that each cohort of students enrolls in GEO 308 at the very beginning of the study programme in the department, the course is thus often experienced as challenging. Nonetheless, exam results indicate that the majority of students are ultimately performing well in relation to the course learning objectives and evaluation criteria.

As a result of these examination outcomes, the core components of GEO 308 will largely be maintained in Autumn 2023. In response to student feedback, the course description will be clarified to remove any doubt that seminar participation and attendance is mandatory. In addition, further contributions to the course will be sought from department staff with expertise in physical geography or biogeography, which will strengthen the relevance of the course across all of the department's three Master programmes.
