

Emnerapport ENG109 høsten 2015

ENG109 *Varieties of English* har som mål å gi studentene kunnskap om og innsikt i språklige særtrekk ved ulike internasjonale varianter av engelsk. Emnet skal også gi studentene et presist språkvitenskapelig begrepsapparat som arbeidsredskap. Emnet bygger på ENG101.

Pensum består av en lærebok på 220 sider, samt et kapittel på 45 sider. Læreboken dekker alle språklige aspekter ved internasjonale varianter, mens kurset har fokusert kun på fonologiske trekk. Emnets omfang er altså relativt lite.

ENG109 gikk som eget emne på 5 studiepoeng for første gang høsten 2015, som ett av tre emner i engelsk lingvistikk. Det har tidligere vært en del av 15-poengsemnet ENG106.

Undervisningen har bestått av ukentlige forelesninger, til sammen 24 timer. I forelesningene har det vært lagt inn praktiske øvelser i form av oppgaveløsning og gjennomgang av lydopptak. Studentene har også levert inn en obligatorisk skriftlig oppgave. Ca. 50-60 studenter har møtt jevnlig på forelesningene.

Eksamen var en tre-timers skoleeksamen. 92 studenter var oppmeldt til emnet, og 79 studenter tok eksamen. 83% bestod, og gjennomsnittskarakteren var C.

Studentevalueringer ble gjennomført, både i form av muntlig underveisevaluering og skriftlig sluttevaluering. Studentene er generelt svært fornøyde med emnet. I underveisevalueringen kom det frem at de ønsket flere øvelser og en oversikt over forskjellene mellom de to pensumbøkene (som tidvis opererer med ulike termer og symboler). Begge tiltakene ble gjennomført. I sluttevalueringen uttrykker de aller fleste studentene at de er svært fornøyde med både undervisningen og kurset som helhet. De få negative kommentarene går på at noen synes emnet er for vanskelig (særlig de som ikke har tatt ENG101) og/eller for omfattende.

Samlet vurdering: Gjennomføringen av kurset har i all hovedsak gått svært bra. Emnets omfang og undervisningsmengde er etter faglærers mening passe, med tanke på at studentene tar to andre lingvistikkurs samtidig. Oppgaven som studentene leverer i løpet av semesteret bør ikke være obligatorisk, da dette fører med seg utrolig mye administrativt ekstraarbeid, samt stresser studentene. Vurderingsformen (skriftlig skoleeksamen) passer godt til emnet. I fremtiden kunne det imidlertid vært ønskelig med digital skoleeksamen som inkluderer lydig materiale.

I do not really understand phonetics (I think my brain filled up two years ago, so no room for new alphabets), but the lecturer's good mood and engaging lecturing makes it worth it to go to class anyway. The posted summaries on Mi Side are valuable and much appreciated. I do worry about the exam, though. How can three hours possibly be enough? Three hour exams should never account for 100% of the grade.

The textbooks are somewhat imprecise.

The course is a bit big for a 5 point course. The exams should be further apart.

How to use lexical sets/keywords would have been helpful.

Good and interesting lectures. The textbooks were sometimes unclear and confusing, not corresponding to the lectures.

Sometimes a lot of things were taken for granted and it was hard for people who didn't take ENG101 or other linguistics courses.

This course is great! The only thing that is negative is that it is a bit big to be a 5 credit course. That goes for all the 5 credit courses (ENG107, 108, 109). But other than that, just keep doing what you are doing!

The lecturer has been wonderful in making the subject matter understandable. Logical and clear progression, and predictable structure within the lectures. Very helpful in understanding the course content. My main criticism is that the course covers and expects a lot for being only 5 credits.
